#### Forest Ownership Stats

In the four counties hosting the ANF, we are focused on the fact that the National Forest occupies a large portion of the land mass. However, when you look at the entire state, you find that the majority of PA forest land is actually privately owned. Here are the numbers:

State Forest	12%
State Game Lands	9%
Allegheny National Forest	3%
Private Forest Landowners	71%
Other	5%

## ANF Salvage Plans for Windthrow Damage

In October, the ANF began addressing the May 1, 2017 windthrow damage on the Kane Experimental Forest. Salvage of 140 acres of downed and damaged trees is underway to recover the marketable timber. The salvage will also allow the Forest Service to assess the effects of windthrow on the longterm Allegheny Hardwood Management Strategy Study.

**Bradford Forest Restoration** (updated): Forest, McKean, Warren; Harvesting & reforestation; Comment Period: September—December 2017. **Chaffee EA (updated):** Elk, Forest; Timber harvesting; Comment Period: August—November 2017.

**Tracy Ridge (updated):** Forest Plan amendment to allow mountain biking on 12.5 miles of hiking trails; Comment Period: July—November 2017.

**Pine Bear Supplemental EA** (updated): Forest Products, Vegetation Management, Road Management; Comment Period: Anticipated April 2018.
